

From 2 to 10 April 2022, the ZEIT-Stiftung Ebelin und Gerd Bucerius, in cooperation with the Observer Research Foundation, holds its twentieth annual Bucerius Summer School on Global Governance (BSS). Participants are inspired by – and learn from – distinguished speakers, well-known public figures in politics, business, academia and the NGO sphere.

Georg Mascolo, Journalist, and Eberhard Sandschneider, Partner, Berlin Global Advisors chair the sessions of the Bucerius Summer School. The lectures and workshops will be held at the Hotel Le Méridien on the banks of the Alster and at the Kampnagel Theater in Hamburg. At Kampnagel, participants attend the ZEIT-Stiftung's EuropaCamp, a public event with lectures, panel discussions and a cultural program. Georg Mascolo, Eberhard Sandschneider, and Director Sascha Suhrke with his team are responsible for the program.

The Bucerius Summer School has always been more than just a high-profile conference. It is about building networks and enhancing cross-cultural cooperation of representatives from all walks of public life. To follow up on the annual meetings, we run

an active alumni network. With the support of the alumni, the ZEIT-Stiftung and the Observer Research Foundation organize regional follow-up seminars.
